1 Nephi 1: 3–6

- *Each of you select one of these chapters from 1st Nephi 3-6*
- *Scan the chapter look for ways that God directly or indirectly blessed Lehi’s family*
- *Share what you find*
- *What do these accounts teach us about the importance of the scriptures?*
- *How did Lehi study the plates of brass? 1st Nephi 5:10-19*
- *What was Lehi’s attitude towards the scriptures?*
- *What value did he find in them?*
- *Read Richard G. Scotts message: “The Power of Scripture”*
- *How can we apply Elder Scotts message as we study the scriptures this year?*
- *How has personal scripture study blessed your life?*
- *How have the scriptures inspired you to “Come unto God and be saved?”*

1 Nephi 2:11–19; 3:28–31
